In an effort to reach the GGAPP coalition goal; ***to increase community wide awareness of the risks of drugs and alcohol use by 10%*** we will begin working on scheduling four community dialogs. It is our hope that we can strengthen collaboration among the four East Multnomah County's communities' private nonprofit agencies, schools and local governments to prevent and reduce substance abuse among youth. Through dialog we hope to;

- Inform, create and build a dynamic constituency to support community work.
- Build opportunities to partner and collaborate.
- Develop concrete actions for future planning and advocacy.
- Design strategies for resources and greater services cohesion.

Each dialog will be facilitated and may include one or more of the following topics for discussion:

- Assisting and supporting our schools prevention efforts.
- Police and public safety services needs – implementing a Peer Court.
- Homelessness – families, youth and single adults
- Poverty - emergency food, shelter and clothing.
- Community violence issues.
- Community services for parks, recreation and health.
- Employment supporting businesses and drug free workplaces.
- Mental health and drug treatment resources.

The meetings will be held the first Thursday of each quarter; the meetings will be convened in four community locations from 3-5 p.m. on a week day.

## **DRUG FREE WORKPLACE**

WorkDrugFreeOregon in partnership with the Gresham Chamber of Commerce is part of the Oregon state-wide business plan initiative to train local business on the implementation of Drug Free Workforce policies. Their efforts link to GGAPP via the initiative's fourth goal to *Elevate Importance of Student Job Readiness*. On February 21st local business leaders will be trained on how to make presentations to high school age youth about drug free employment opportunities. ## **COMMUNITY PEER COURT**

Local law enforcement, schools, the district attorney's office and local cities have convened to develop a work team for the peer court project. The group visited the Beaverton Peer court in November and will be meeting with officials from various jurisdictions over the next month. Three Portland State University students from the Criminal Justice program have joined the team and will be helping to design systems and presentations. Peer courts provide adjudication to non-violent local crime issues such as graffiti, vandalism, and alcohol and marijuana possession. Call for meeting times this spring – join us!
